School Psychologist

Belmont Day School seeks a full-time school psychologist to work with children in pre-kindergarten to grade eight through assessment, support, and counseling. This role is both student-facing and serves as a member of the learning support team. The person in this role will join a team of learning support specialists and the school counselor. They will be responsible for analyzing student testing, including but not limited to neuropsychological testing, and work collaboratively with colleagues to support student's academic, social, and emotional growth.

This is a ten-month, full-time, exempt, and benefit-eligible position. This position is not eligible for employer-sponsored relocation.

Responsibilities:

- Work with faculty to identify, assess, and provide support for students
- Develop and support the implementation of academic interventions
- Administer assessments (cognitive, emotional, EF/attention, academic)
- Advise teachers in trends, research, and current best practices to create and sustain inclusive, supportive, and effective learning communities
- Create and maintain records to ensure continuity of care and services
- Be an integral member of the school's health and wellness team, assisting with curriculum development and content delivery
- Attend weekly meetings with the learning support team
- Collaborate with the learning support team to recommend and manage neuropsychological evaluation processes
- Partner with the school counselor to deliver short-term, targeted interventions for individuals and groups to support social-emotional learning (Tiers 1, 2, and 3)
- Develop and support the implementation of positive behavior plans
- Assess student safety and draft safety contracts as needed
- Support the administrative team in communicating sensitive issues to colleagues and families
- Plan and deliver faculty training (e.g., faculty meetings and professional development days)
- Advise and support the admissions team in assessing prospective students



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Competencies and qualifications:

- Be trained as a school psychologist with a Ph.D./Psy.D.
- Commitment to equity, inclusion, and belonging for all students and families
- Experience in a school environment
- Experience administering and evaluating learning and neuropsychological assessments
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- High level of organization
- Flexibility and commitment to being a part of a vigorous and thoughtful learning community
