Athletic Trainer

Belmont Day School seeks a part-time athletic trainer to support afternoon middle school athletics, and the after school programming for pre-kindergarten to eighth grade students.

This is a part-time, 15-hours per week, non-exempt position that is not eligible for benefits. This is a 10-month position and reports to the school nurse. Hours for this position are Monday through Friday, 2:30 to 5:30 p.m. This position begins on August 28, 2023.

Responsibilities

- Provide athletic training services for the school's athletic department, including attendance at scheduled team practices and home competitions as needed.
- Provide nursing services to students in the After School Program as needed.
- Coordinate with the school nurse in the treatment of any athletic injury, or other injury to any student.
- Responsible for monitoring injured students as they progress toward recovery.
- Coordinate with the director of athletics and coaches as needed.
- Coordinate with the director of school year auxiliary and specialty programs as needed.
- Act under the direct supervision of the school physician.
- Maintain accurate and detailed records of all injuries and treatments.
- Support the School Receptionist by covering the front desk..
